

For example, everyday household cleaning products are frequently used in workplaces. These products often have hazard symbols indicating they are a hazardous substance.

Furthermore, not all hazardous substances have labels to warn you of the dangers which is why you must be aware of the different types and forms of hazardous substances you may encounter in your workplace.


Hazardous Substances (COSHH)

Employee responsibilities

- To co-operate with your employer and observe the control measures put in place for your safety.
- To wear and maintain suitable PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) as appropriate.
- To inform your manager of any defects in equipment or processes. Reporting defects allows for immediate rectification.
- To store dangerous substances in any special accommodation provided.
- To participate in any health surveillance checks during working hours if required. You are also entitled to access your health surveillance record.


What parts of the body can hazardous substances affect?
